






## EDITOR'S NOTE

Hairy tongue is a result of hypertrophy, elongation, and defective desquamation of the filiform papillae of the tongue and may present in a variety of colors depending on the specific etiology that may include poor oral hygiene, lack of mechanical stimulation, use of medications and therapeutic radiation of the head and neck.

**Dr. Ian Pun**, *et al.*, examines *Treatment of a Patient with HBeAg-negative Chronic Hepatitis B*. Chronic hepatitis B is mostly an asymptomatic disease, therefore, serological and imaging tests should be used to identify, follow, and treat those considered high risk. Over the past decade effective anti-viral treatments have become available.

We have a *Clinico-Pathological Quiz* by **Drs. Pradeep Shenoy and Lyew Warren** from the Cambellton Regional Hospital in New Brunswick. A case of a fleshy, granular, pedunculated growth from the oral cavity is presented. A differential diagnosis of similar growths from the oral cavity and the treatment options are discussed.
