In their article *Passive Straight Leg Raise Test: Definition, Interpretation, Limitations and Utilization*, **Dr. Hamilton Hall and Greg McIntosh** highlight the myths and misunderstandings surrounding the straight leg raise (SLR) test for sciatica.

Dr. Pradeep Shenoy and his colleague Curtis M. Marcoux offer *Vertigo and Dizziness: A Brief Review*. Dizziness is the third most common symptom seen in patients of all age groups who present to emergency departments, outpatient clinics and physicians offices. An overview of the epidemiology, etiology, presentation, diagnosis and treatment of the most common causes of vertigo will be presented, touching on some of the more rare determinants.

Dr. Pradeep Shenoy presents *A Case of Recurrent Pyogenic Granuloma of Gingiva*. Aetiology factors, clinical presentations and different treatment modalities of this entity are discussed after reviewing the literature.
